Background

- Major institutions in Japan have done and are doing significant efforts for building digital collections since mid-1990s
 - National Diet Library (NDL)
 - National Institute of Informatics (NII)
 - National Hub for University Libraries
 - University Libraries
 - Japan Science and Technology Agency (JST)
 - National Museums
 - National Archives of Japan (NAJ)

Background

- Activities at public libraries and by grassroots
 - Public libraries have adopted Web as an important gateway to them
 - Some public libraries built digital collections of regional cultural resources
 - Aozora Bunko – a digital text collection of Japanese novels built by volunteers
- e-Japan and u-Japan programs by the national government to promote information infrastructure

Goal of this Talk

- Overview of activities for digital libraries and archives at major Japanese institutions over the past decade
 - Overview from broader scope to catch a larger and comprehensive figure
 - Digitization of cultural heritage is an important part
- Briefly discuss issues on long-term preservation and use of digital archives

National Diet Library

(国立国会図書館)

- Some Early Projects
 - Project in early 1990s with IPA on an experimental digital library
 - A host library for Bibliotheca Universalis – a collaborative DL program among national libraries
- Legal Deposit Library
- Digital Library division at Kansai-kan, located in Kansai

National Diet Library

(国立国会図書館)

- Digital Collections
 - Kindai Digital Library – Digital Collection of Books published in Meiji to Taisho Era (Late 19th century to early 20th century)
 - Digitization of 143K books
 - Rare Books Image Database
 - 916 titles, 45K images
 - Books, Nishikie (colored wood block prints), Maps
 - Picture Book Gallery at International Library of Children's Literature

National Diet Library

(国立国会図書館)

- Legal Deposit of Electronically Published Resources
 - Resources packaged in a Tangible Medium
 - Networked Resources --- no official service yet
- WARP – Web Archiving Project
 - Government Sites, Public Sector Sites, University Sites, Event Sites
- Long-term Preservation of Digital Resources
 - Metadata Schemas
 - Experiments and reports

National Institute of Informatics

(国立情報学研究所)

- National Hub for University Libraries
 - Research center and service center as a hub for university libraries
 - Provides Webcat (union catalog of Japanese university libraries) and databases
 - Formerly, National Center for Science Information Systems
 - Academic Portal (GeNii)
 - Webcat, Scholarly and Academic Information Navigator, etc.

National Institute of Informatics

(国立情報学研究所)

- Institutional Repositories
 - Collaboration with university libraries
- Digital Silk Road project
 - Collaboration with the Oriental Library (東洋文庫)
- Cultural Heritage Online
 - Collaboration with Museums

University Libraries (大学図書館)

- Some of Digitization Projects
 - Kyoto University Library (京都大学)
 - Cultural Heritage Collection
 - Kobe University Library (神戸大学)
 - Records in various formats from the Kobe Quake
 - Keio University Library (慶應義塾大学)
 - Cultural Heritage, Fukuzawa Collection
 - University of Tokyo Library (東京大学)
 - Cultural Heritage, Ogai Collection, rare books

University Libraries (大学図書館)

- Institutional Repositories
 - A Major Project under the CSI program hosted by NII
 - 76 Repositories
 - AIRway project: Access path to Information Resources via link resolvers
 - A collaborative projects by participating university libraries
 - Enhancing reachability to resources by collecting metadata from participating repositories

National Archives of Japan

(国立公文書館)

- NAJ Digital Collection
 - Digital Archive System
 - Catalog DB
 - Collection of Digitized Resources
 - Digital Gallery
 - Exhibition of Historical Records
 - Bunzo
 - Exhibition for Learners and Children

National Archives of Japan

(国立公文書館)

- Digital Collection at Japan Center for Asian Historical Records
 - Beginning of Meiji Era (1860s) to 1945
 - Resources collected from
 - National Archives of Japan
 - Diplomatic Records Office (Ministry of Foreign Affairs)
 - National Institute for Defense Studies (Ministry of Defense)
 - Records from Former Japanese Army and Navy
 - 1 M items, 14.3 M images (as of January 2008)
- Archiving governmental records and documents in electronic forms
 - A study committee to discuss archiving of electronic records and documents
 - Evaluation of electronic records archiving

Japan Science and Technology Agency (科学技術振興機構)

- Information and database provider for the science and technology community
- J-Stage
 - Helping academic societies publish e-journals
 - 450+ journals, 100+ proceedings, etc.
- Journal@rchive
 - Retrospective collection of scholarly journals in Japan
 - 120+ journals, since late 19th century

Museums

- Major museums provides digital exhibitions on their Web pages
 - Tokyo National Museum
 - University Museum, University of Tokyo
 - Digital Museum
 - Virtual Exhibit, Digital Restoration, etc.
- Cultural Heritage Online
 - Gateway to cultural/scholarly resources owned by museums in Japan

Issues for Future

- Long-term Maintenance and Use of Digital Archives and their Resources
 - What resources/entities to be preserved
 - (Minimum) Functional Requirements
 - Social Factors
- Audience
 - Information Environment Changes
 - From Desk Top to Ubiquitous Information Access
 - User Assistance Functions

Long-term Preservation and Use

- What resources are to be preserved?
 - Digitized/Born-Digital Resources
 - Static/Dynamic Resources
 - 3D Virtual Reality Objects, Databases, Games, etc.
- In general, Digitized & Static resources are easier to preserve. However,
 - Since digitized resources are often provided with sophisticated browsing functions, the boundary between Digitized and Born-Digital is not always clear
 - Even a plain text file is not perfectly stable because of character code set and font changes

Long-term Preservation and Use

- “As is” preservation is preferable but long-term preservation may require functional degradation of documents
 - eg. Converting an HTML page into a page image
- What is the minimum functional requirements on preserved resources?
 - Readability for human
 - Searchability
 - Integrity, e.g. broken links, document boundary
 - Look-and-Feel
 - Accessibility
 - Authenticity

Long-term Preservation and Use

- Social factors
 - Privacy and IPR issues
 - Old resources often have no rights agreement with stakeholders
- Other Issues
 - Metadata Issues
 - Costs for creation and maintenance
 - Trusted Archive/Repository
 - Cost sharing
 - Functions to collect and disseminate resources could be split from long-term trusted archival repository

Summary

- Since mid-1990s, many institutions have been working on digital libraries and archives.
- There are fairly large collections such as NDL's and NAJ's digital archives
- Long-term maintenance and use of digital archives and “Really-usable Digital Archive” are crucial issues for further development of digital archives.
